The Director of Field Education and Contextual Learning provides program development/administration and educational leadership in Field Education and Contextual Learning for a diverse student body at Pacific School of Religion. Faculty status might be granted to a candidate with the appropriate degree and experience.

- · Ministry experience, including but not limited to church-related settings, for at least five years
- · Familiarity with seminary education, especially previous work experience in seminary setting
- Educator experience in small group processes and critical analysis of theological reflection
- Excellent managerial skills, with the ability to work independently to oversee field education, contextual learning and related projects
- Proficiency in interpersonal skills
- Ability to work collegially with students, faculty and staff, and wider field education communities
- · Excellent writing skills
- · Well organized and attentive to detail
- · Ability to maintain strict confidentiality
- Experience in administration, preferably in theological education
- · Ability to work effectively in an interdenominational, multicultural community of diverse theological perspectives
- · Ability to coordinate multiple projects and priorities and meet multiple deadlines · Supervisory competence
- Experience overseeing budgets
- Readiness to affirm PSR's ecumenical and Christian heritage and commitment as an open and affirming community that honors diversity and presses toward racial, gender, sexual orientation and economic justice
- · Active connections to faith communities
- Knowledge, experience, and/or familiarity with non-profit organizations desirable
- Proficiency with personal computers especially Microsoft Word Desirable Knowledge, Skills and Abilities
- Knowledge of Master of Divinity program and the communities of faith and field education in this geographic area
- · Familiarity with the faith traditions represented in the PSR community
- Knowledge of Filemaker Pro computer program

Details:

In relation to Field Education

- Develop praxis based Field Education program for primarily but not exclusively M.Div students
- · Seek opportunities for development of creative teaching in relation to Field Education Seminars, including the

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use of newer technologies

- Research and develop new models of Field Education specifically for MTS students, distance learning and entrepreneurial/community based sites
 Oversee recruitment and teaching of Field Education adjunct faculty
- Teach theory and practice of mentoring to site mentors and field based communities (9 11 seminars per year)
- Develop and negotiate student placement sites with local clergy and directors of non-profit agencies
- Advise students regarding field education requirements and provide vocational counseling
- · Teach field education course
- Serve as consultant and mediator for sites, mentors and students when necessary
- Communicate with faculty advisors of students about Field Education and overall academic and vocational plans
- Meet with prospective students and represent Field Education at Ministry as Vocation, orientation, and church and community events
- Keep listings of potential CPE sites and advise students concerning CPE placements
- · Oversee visits from clergy and denominational representatives and facilitate meetings with students
- Attend monthly GTU FE Directors meetings/coordination of GTU FE events including CPE day

In relation to Contextual Learning

- Develop in consultation with faculty the international, national and regional immersion intensive courses
- Develop programming philosophies and directions in relation to contextual learning and encounters
- Identify new contextual partnerships that are compatible with the vision and mission of PSR educational programs

Overall

- Maintain an overall knowledge of both programs and provide administrative oversight to the field education and contextual learning office
- Provide programs that will foster sensitivity to cross-cultural, ecumenical, interfaith, racial, gender, sexual
 orientation and economic issues
- Develop materials with participating faculty for educational components of both programs
- Supervise Associate Field Education and Contextual Learning Director and, if and when applicable, other staff
 of the Field Education and Contextual Learning Office
- Develop and oversee Field Education and Contextual Learning budgets
- Report field education and contextual learning activities and issues to the Dean regularly and to the faculty as needed
- Submit written reports on Field Education and Contextual Learning to the Board of Trustees at least once per year (sometimes twice)
- Attend faculty meetings and regularly report on field education and contextual learning issues; attend Faculty Executive Session if granted faculty status or at the direction of the Dean
- Attend student services staff meetings as needed or required
